



Artist going places fast

MACLEAY Island artist Madeleine Ekeblad has double cause for celebration with the recent release of her fourth book plus the forthcoming appearance of her art work in the Asia Contemporary Art Show in Hong Kong later this month.

Her book, *Controlling Elephants with Sabre-Tooth Tigers*, is a compilation of her three previous motivational books for artists.

She said the book was a tool for both artists and teachers and stemmed from an earlier Artslink Queensland request for her to present a motivational workshop to teachers of all subjects.

In addition to a vast range of motivational tips for artists, the book also offers suggestions for art educators and ideas for integrating art with all subjects, including the more analytical subjects of science and maths.

Madeline will launch her book with a talk and painting exhibition at Redland Museum on Wednesday, May 15 at 2pm.
